


Began as Washington County Land Trust in 1991.

 Permanently preserve land and water resources


### • RESTORE:

 Engage the public to foster a culture of conservation








### **Conservation Easements**

- **PRIVATE LAND**: 75% of Minnesota's landscape is in private ownership.
- PUBLIC BENEFITS: Many of MN's most important natural and cultural resources found on private land.
- LANDOWNER GOALS: Not all landowners willing or able to sell fee title. Not all land appropriate for public ownership.
- COST EFFECTIVENESS: Nor is there enough funding to always purchase in fee title.

My Commission Expires: 1-31-2005

- Legally binding land use restrictions that preserve the conservation values of the land by restricting its use and development
- Enforced by a separate entity, such as a unit of government or a nonprofit organization







## **Conservation Easements**

#### Land Trust conservation easements are:

- All different
- Permanent, run with title to the land

#### **Prohibit:**

- Industrial & commercial use
- Development

#### Permit:

- Land management, with a plan
- Exclusion of public

### Restrict:

- Division
- Residential use, structures, improvements
- Agriculture, forestry
- Alteration of wetlands, shorelines, vegetation, topography







# Protected Land Management

- Responsibility of landowner
- Habitat management plan & detailed action plan approved by Land Trust
- Conservation grazing, timber harvest, mowing, vegetation removal, etc. are permitted in accordance with plan
- Technical & financial assistance; in some cases implementation
